For this class we will be exploring the wonderful world of wild things.

We will also be a learning new, non-coloring specific art technique called cross hatching.

Before you begin:

In this class we are going to be coloring an illustration from Maurice Sendak's *Where the Wild Things Are*, but before we get started a bit of housekeeping... You may notice that the line drawing included with this class is different than the one I used in the video. The reason for this is sipmle. In this particular instance the colored line drawing I used in the video made the coloring process more difficult than it needed to be. A black line drawing would have worked better, so that's what I've given you.

Also, somewhere in chapter 2 my video equipment failed so a few steps were lost. But don't worry! I'll explain what to do and all will be well! In the end you'll have an awesome image. So while things got a little "wild" on the production side, the end result will tame the most savage of beasts!

Chapter One: Coloring The Leaves





This is the colored line drawing... not the best idea I've ever had! It was printed out on heavy 110 lb. card stock.



I begin the coloring with YG67. I keep this color confined to the "shadow side" of the leaves.



I color the "light side" of the leaves with YG63...



I accidentally colored the bull monster's elbow green in this step! It didn't cause problems, but you don't have to color it wrong too if you don't want to!

I add darker accents with W6...

I then add some details to the leaves (W6)...

After the W6.



I restate the details in the upper row of leaves with G99.



After the G99.



I then soften the G99 with G24.



I darken the shadow side of the second row of leaves with G99.

I then darken the light sides with Y67.

This second row of leaves is darker than the top row because the top leaves are placing them in shadow.



I add details to the second row with G99.



It looks rough and unfinished, but for now the leaves are complete!

Chapter Two: Coloring Max and the Monsters





With the color and values of the leaves established we can now turn our attention to Max and the monsters.

As I mentioned earlier things get a little "wild" in this chapter, but we will get through it!



I begin by coloring the first wild thing's face with a flat layer of E11.

Mr. Sendak never gave them names, so we will call him "Moe" and the other one we will call "Larry". :)

The "over color" into the beard area is intentional.



I color the nose and around the eyes with E13.



I add shadow shapes with E15...



...then soften and brighten the color of the nose with R02.



Continuing with the R02 I define the cheeks...



...and mouth line. (R02)



After the R02.



I add "blush" to the cheeks with R21...



...then add very dark accents to the nose and eyes with E29.



I soften the E29 with E13...

...and hit the outside corners of the mouth. (E13)



After the E13.



I blend the colors of the face with an overall layer of E00.



After the E00.



I add shadow accents between the teeth with E15.



I then add a soft shadow to the bottom jaw with E13.



After the E13.



I blend the E13 on the bottom jaw with E11.



I then add Y00 to the eye balls.



I add W3 shadows on the eye balls...



...then soften the W3 with Y00.



I color the iris with YG67...







...then darken the pupils with E29.

Ok, here's where things got wild :(Again, a camera malfunction is to blame. As you can see, I've colored Moe's body, horns, and hair with nary a step by step photo to be seen! Sorry about that! But don't worry, I've got you covered. Hopefully you guys won't send me to bed without my supper!

Ok so here's what I did... I colored Moe's body and arm with a flat base color of Y21. I then added the darker stripes with YR24. Next I softened the YR24 with an overall blend layer of Y21. Easy peasy.

For the horns I colored a W3 base color and added a W5 shadow shape.

For the hair I used W6 as an overall base, then added hair strokes with E29.

See? No worries!

Next, I add E15 shadows here...



...under the beard area, and to the raised arm (E15).



I add W6 to the same areas...

W6 on the belly under the arm...



I soften the W6 with E13...



...then strengthen the stripes with YR14.



After the YR14.



I "stroke" in the beard with E29...

...then add W6 accent strokes.



Next, I add more hair strokes with W8...

After the W8.



I soften the hairline into the face with E13...



...then accent the mouth with E29.



It looks rough, but trust me, it's gonna be awesome!



I add W8 to that white area between Moe's head and hand...



...then add W8 accent areas to the areas where Moe's head and the leaves meet.



I darken the pupils with W8...

...then color the claws with W3...



...and the toes too! (W3)



I color the bottom half of Moe's body with a flat base color or W1.



I then add W3 shadow shapes.



I accentuate the "scales" with W4...



...then add very dark accents with W6.





After the W6.



I then do an overall blend layer with W1.



Getting close... Just about a "foot" to go! ;)

I add W6 shadows to the claws, both foot and hand...



...and the other hand... (W6)



...and the colors for Moe are complete.



Turning my attention to Larry, I add a flat base color of C1.



I then add basic shadow shapes with C4...

I add C5...

Next, I add C7...

I soften all the "C's" with C2...

I restate my major hair strokes with C4...

I color the horns with a W3 base.



Don't forget the claws! (W3)



I add Y00 to the eye balls...



...and B04 to the iris.



I add W5 shadows to the horns and claws.



I accentuate Larry's eyes with C5...







Larry's colors are now complete.



I color Max's face with a flat base of E00.



I then add E02 accents.



I add R21 "blush" to the cheeks...



...then blend the face with E00.



R27 on the scepter...



...then YR24 on the scepter and crown.



After the YR24.



I add E15 shadows to the crown...



...then blend the E15 with YR24.



I "shape" the fluffy part of the crown with W5...



...then soften the W5 with W3.



I color Max's wolf suit with a flat base of E41...



...then add E81 shadow shapes...

After the E81.



I add darker shadow accents with W3...







...and Max's colors are complete!




Finally, I add W8 shadow shapes throughout the background...

I add W8 accents between Larry's teeth...



...under his ear... (W8)



...to the bend in his arm... (W8)



...and to his butt. (W8)

...and around the eyes. (W8)



Now all we gotta fix is that elbow!
